This is the first official meeting for the Golden Lane Estate Residents' Liaison Group. The meeting's agenda was:

- 1. Update on the project
- 2. Discussion with Project Manager
- 3. Future works
- 4. Suggestions for items for discussion at future meetings.
- 5. Confirm date of the next meeting (every other month from now on) **Thursday 24**August

Summary of points raised.

- There were questions raised about the lack of attendance of members of the project team, these were not big concerns.
- Questions about the consultation process. For example, were letters sent out on important information, such as a brief inspection of one room on each floor.
- Concerns were raised about timeline and disruption to local residents.

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- Questions were raised about 'common parts'.
- Questions were raised about leaseholder prices, and whether they have to pay a high price for common parts.
- Residents were requesting more information on the reasons for choice of windows.
- There was an insistence on the need for their voices to be listened to.
- Residents wished to have clarity on the costs. Especially if it's done on a case-by-case basis. Also concerns that the costs will keep increasing.
- Criticisms were raised about the process, arguing that it has been taking too long.
- There was a consensus that the windows need to be fixed.
- Question about whether the building is listed.
- Residents again demonstrated the importance of clarifying the level of disruption that
 they will face and particularly the level of disruption that vulnerable people will face,
 particularly those with disabilities.
- Questions were raised about whether there will be a lot of engagement from the project team, as there were concerns raised that not enough people had been engaged, as there were only 5 people that attended the meeting.
- Ouestions were made on the guidelines for allocating people to guest homes.
- There was a sense that the Estate has been neglected for many years.
- Questions were also made about whether people's allergies have been taken into account.



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
